

# Emergency Action Card

## Post-intubation hypotension

**State out loud:**

"The patient has developed hypotension"

**Action:**

**If critical features**

**Loss of central pulse  
Falling ET CO<sub>2</sub>**

- Consider low flow state or cardiac arrest
- Immediate concurrent management of presumed causes e.g. Hypovolaemia, Tension pneumothorax
- Consider vasopressors/volume replacement

**Check:**

### 1 Airway/Breathing

- Check for bilateral chest wall movement
- Ensure ventilator is set to 100% oxygen
- Consider pneumothorax and treat
- Check CO<sub>2</sub> trace

### 2 Circulation

- Check central and peripheral pulses/ECG
- Re-cycle blood pressure cuff
- Replace volume
- In trauma ensure bleeding is controlled

### 3 Anaesthetic

- Pause sedative infusions/Avoid further boluses

#### Potential causes

- Hypovolaemia
- Tension pneumothorax
- Myocardial (tamponade / contusion / ischaemia)
- Secondary to positive pressure ventilation and/or drugs administered
- Anaphylaxis
- Bradycardia
- Neurogenic shock
- Monitor error
